FOURTH QUARTER 2003 PROGRESS REPORT OCTOBER THROUGH DECEMBER 2003

A concise summary of investigative actions completed during the fourth quarter of 2003 to comply with Consent Order No. SRD-128 is presented below. In addition, a list of actions proposed to be completed in the following quarter of 2004 is also shown below.

Actions Completed During Fourth Quarter of 2003

- Research of investigative tools available for completing full characterization of site materials.
- Investigating methods for deriving site-specific Pollutant Mobility Criteria.
- Completion of water-quality sampling round in October and November 2003 for all site wells installed by Leggette, Brashears and Graham, Inc. (LBG) during 2002 site investigation. Depth to water measurements were also collected from all available regional monitor wells. Ground-water monitor wells were sampled for volatile organic compounds, semi-volatile organic compounds, extractable total petroleum hydrocarbons, pesticides, polychlorinated biphenyls, priority pollutant metals plus vanadium, tin, cobalt, barium and cyanide.
- Updated internal water-quality database. In process of updating regional water-quality database and creating additional regional ground-water flow map.
- At request of Connecticut Department of Environmental Protection (CTDEP), submitted all depth to water level data for regional wells to CTDEP and Malcolm Pirnie. The submittal also included the April and July 2003 ground-water flow maps.

Actions Proposed to be Completed During First Quarter of 2004 (January through March 2004

Submit work plan to address data gaps identified by the South Central
Connecticut Regional Water Authority/LBG and CTDEP coming out of the work
documented in the 2002 environmental site investigation report, within 30 days of
receipt of CTDEP comments on the report, or by the end of March 2004,
whichever is sooner.

- Submit electronic and hard copies versions of 2002 investigation report and quarterly progress reports to CTDEP consultant (Fitzgerald and Halliday) for public use.
- Complete water-quality sampling during February 2004. The parameter list will be same as July and October/November 2003 analytical list. Sampling will be completed as part of site compliance monitoring.
- Collect round of regional depth to water measurements. Develop and submit regional potentiometric surface map.
- Dependant on CTDEP comment and review period of proposed submitted site characterization work plan, commencement of site or constituent specific characterization field investigation.
